The National Kitten Coalition offers full-day workshops, shorter classes and consultation services. Our experts are also available to speak at conferences or other events on topics mutually agreed upon by the Coalition and the hosting organization.

Workshops

Our full-day workshop covers vital kitten-care information. In addition to our core curriculum, most sessions are customized based on the issues and challenges host organizations perceive in their own agencies. Workshop topics include neonatal care, pregnancy, medical issues, treatment options, sanitation and supplies. Medical topics include infectious diseases, diarrhea, internal and external parasites, ringworm and more. Instructors will also discuss how to build and use a nebulizer to treat upper respiratory illnesses. Shorter duration workshops focus on individual topics such as neonatal care, respiratory infections, parasites and foster volunteer training. This list is not exhaustive, and the Coalition welcomes topic ideas suggested by the hosting organization.



Consultation Services

Coalition experts are available for one-on-one consultations on a variety of subjects, including all workshop topics as well as tips on building a successful foster program or how to set up a kitten nursery at your animal shelter or rescue organization.

Speaking Engagements

Coalition instructors are available to speak at conferences and events. Past engagements have included the Humane Society of the United States Animal Care Expo, New England Federation of Humane Societies Conference, Alley Cat Allies National Conference and many others.
